

# Emergency dispatchers, are you ready for an electric or gas emergency?

Here are the critical questions to ask when you receive an emergency call.

## **Electric emergencies**

- What is your name?
- What is your phone number?
- · Where is the incident? What's the address or nearest address or intersection?
- Is anyone injured?
- · Are emergency responders on-site?
- · Are lines, equipment or a substation smoking or arcing?
- Are any lines low or downed?
- · Are any lines contacting vehicles, machinery, roadways, structures or other areas?
- · Are any poles broken?
- · Are any wires or poles affecting traffic?

### **Gas emergencies**

- What is your name?
- What is your phone number?
- · Where is the incident? What's the address or nearest address or intersection?
- Are emergency responders on-site?
- · Is gas odor inside or outside?

#### If inside:

- · Is anyone sick or injured?
- Are occupants still inside?
- · Is the building accessible? How?

#### If outside:

- · Is the location accessible? How?
- Was a gas line hit?
- · Are any emergency responders on-site?
