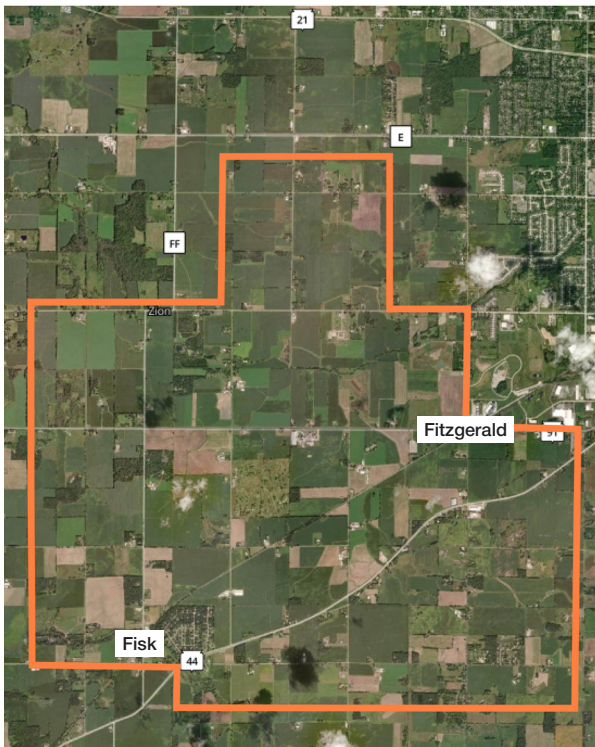

Our approach to energy generation is evolving to meet the growing needs of customers and communities. Guided by our Energy Blueprint, we plan and invest in a balanced energy portfolio that brings together renewable resources, battery storage and traditional generation to deliver reliable, cost-effective energy. This approach supports economic growth and helps keep customer bills as low as possible.

The Oshkosh Solar Project, a proposed project of 130-megawatt in Algoma, Nekimi, Utica and Omro, will contribute to clean energy generation in Wisconsin and our balanced energy mix that provides safe, reliable energy.



Solar is cost-effective and fuel-free

We added approximately 1,000 megawatts of solar energy in Wisconsin since 2022. Solar is a cost-effective part of our balanced resource mix that generates fuel-free energy. When the sun shines, it provides a constant, abundant energy supply.

- Solar provides significant economic benefits to our customers and the communities we serve.
- Project construction creates good-paying jobs and stimulates local economies.
- Landowners who lease land receive annual payments for the duration of the solar project's life.
- Communities with solar projects receive tax incentives they can use as they deem appropriate. Some communities use funds to build infrastructure, renovate public buildings and improve emergency response services.

To advance the benefits of solar, we meet regularly with community members and elected officials to engage in meaningful dialogue and ensure project results benefit all communities. We also work closely with the agriculture industry, labor groups, landowners and environmental stakeholders to minimize the effect on water, land and wildlife.
