<u>Availability:</u> To individual customers or to groups of customers within the Company's Large Power and Lighting class who are determined to be subject to "effective competition".

"Effective competition" exists if the customer or customer group is located within the Company's assigned service area and the customer or customer group has the ability to obtain its energy requirements from an energy supplier that is not regulated by the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (MPUC) under Section 216B.16.

Availability is restricted to those customers with connected loads of not less than 2,000 kW.

Rate: To be specified in contract for service.

<u>Terms and Conditions:</u> The Company will offer competitive rates under the following terms:

- A contract for service must be completed and filed as a rate schedule with the MPUC.
- (2) All provisions of the Company's Large Power and Lighting rate (including appropriate riders) shall apply except as may be modified in parts (3) through (8) below.
- (3) Rates under this tariff are subject to the approval, modification or disapproval of the MPUC. If the competitive rate is modified by the MPUC, the MPUC will issue an order modifying the competitive rate. This modification is subject to the approval of the Company and the customer, who have ten days in which to reject the proposed modification. If no party rejects the proposed modification, the MPUC order becomes final. If either party rejects the MPUC proposed modification, the Company on its behalf or on the behalf of the customer, may submit to the MPUC a modified version of the MPUC proposal.

The rate pursuant to this tariff may take effect on an interim basis after the filing of the contract with the MPUC and upon the date specified. While an interim competitive rate is in effect, the difference between rates under the competitive rate and rates under the standard tariff for that class are not subject to recovery or refund. If the MPUC does not approve the rate, the Company may seek to recover the difference in revenues between the interim competitive rate and the standard tariff from the customer who was offered the competitive rate.

(4) The minimum rate offered under this schedule shall recover at least the incremental cost of providing the service including the cost of additional capacity that is to be added while the rate is in effect and any applicable on-peak or off-peak differential.

- (8) No rate shall be offered under this schedule to a customer in which the Company has a financial interest greater than fifty (50) percent.

The rates in this tariff reflect interim levels pending the outcome of IPL's rate case. Interim rates are subject to refund.
